

We've been busy developing our journey to achieve zero carbon status by 2030. Here are some of the highlights from our fourth year...

Our electricity continues to come from **renewable sources**



Kerbside flexible plastics recycling scheme launched for **6,700 households**

Recycle rate of **43%** across the district



Local cycling and walking infrastructure plan completed



Installed four EV charging points in Ibstock to bring us up to **24 points across the district**



Over **32,000** trees and hedging plants and **thousands** of spring bulbs given away



Over **3,000 trees** and a Tiny Forest planted at the Hermitage Eco Park

Second Solar Together scheme delivered **316 panels** and **23 batteries** across **26 properties**



Saved **964 tonnes** of CO<sub>2</sub> by switching fuel to HVO (hydro-treated vegetable oil) and we now have 14 electric vehicles in the fleet

We collected **199 tonnes** food waste, saving **149 tonnes** of CO<sub>2</sub>
